PROJECT: BODY WORN CAMERAS

PROJECT SCOPE

- The City must have a policy for Body Worn Cameras prior to purchasing the system.
- Council approves the purchase, staff approves the policy.
- Draft policy will be available for public input

PROJECT CRITERIA

DESIRED INPUT

As cited in Minnesota State Statute 626.8473 Subd.2. **Public comment.** A local law enforcement agency must provide an opportunity for public comment before it purchases or implements a portable recording system. At a minimum, the agency must accept public comments submitted electronically or by mail, and the governing body with jurisdiction over the budget of the law enforcement agency must provide an opportunity for public comment at a regularly scheduled meeting.

Portions of the draft policy are required to meet state statute requirements. The City of Edina must meet those minimum requirements. The City will accept public comment on the policy through an engagement process.

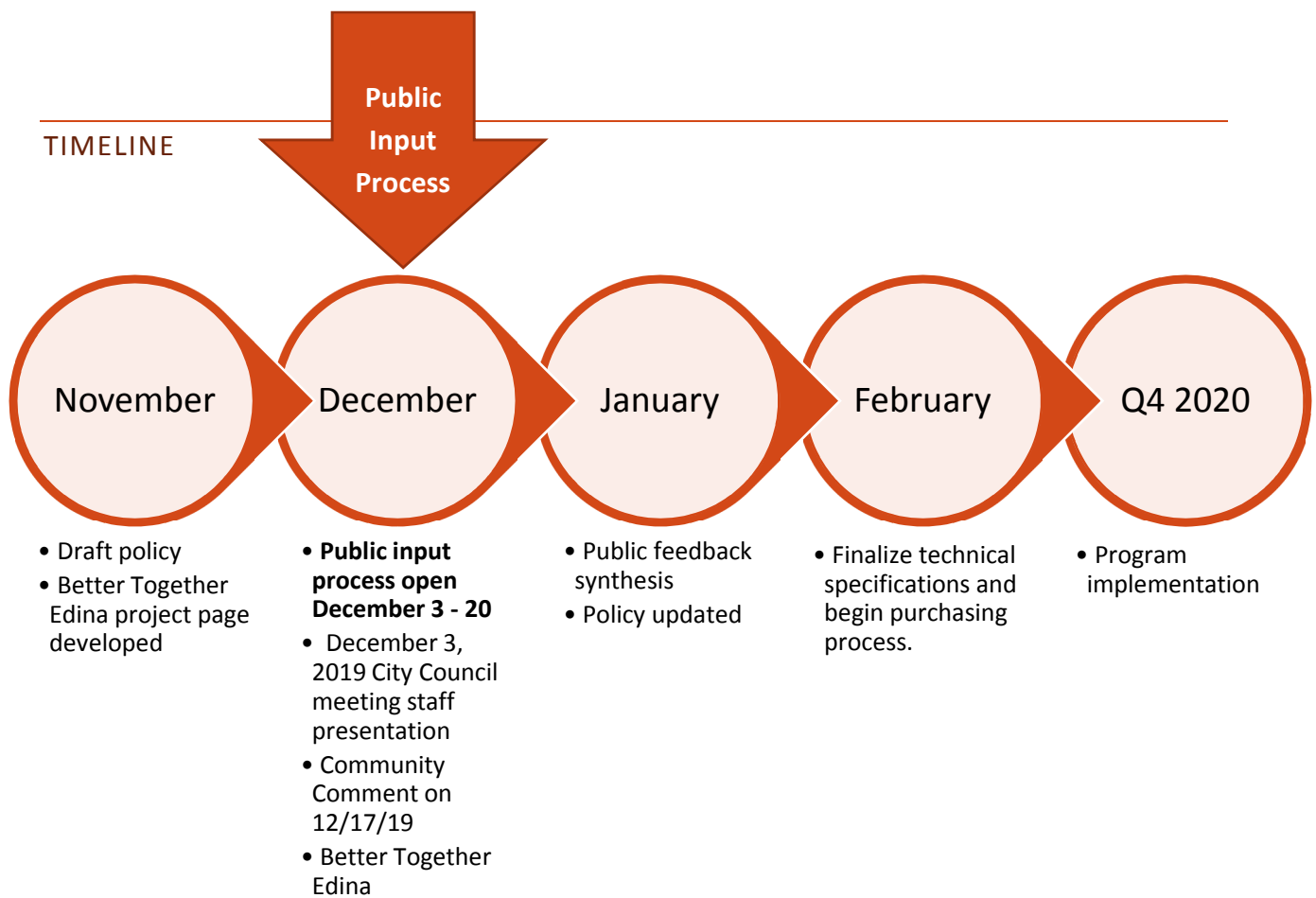
