Licensing and Inspection Program

Purpose



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EDINA

- Health, safety, and welfare of residents
- Shift from reactive to proactive enforcement
- Address concerns of residents living with housing insecurity
- Create inventory of rental housing in City



Purpose



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- Connect with residents in rental housing
- Recognize housing as a social determinant of residents' physical, social, and mental well-being.
- Incorporate crime-free rental housing provisions
- Affordable housing and tenant protection policy enforcement vehicle.



Considerations & Challenges

- Current Edina Health Division (EHD) enforcement
All complaints–International Property Maintenance Code (IPMC)
- Program cost
Initial Cost: vehicles, computers, training, software
Annual Cost: staff salary/benefits, supplies
- Revenue source – property owners
Low income or affordable housing considerations
- Equity Considerations

Licensees



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- Single family homes & duplexes
- Apartments
- Condominium & townhome units
- Not addressed by this program
 - Short-term rental (less than 30 days)
 - Air BnB/Vacation rental by owner (VRBO)
 - **These are not permitted uses by City zoning

Edina Rental Housing Licensing and Inspection Program Data

Program Structure & Staff

- Within Edina Police Department – Health Division
- 1 Administrative staff
- 2 Field staff (1 lead w/experience, 1 entry level)

Rental Property Data

- 87 apartment complexes within Edina
- 6086 apartment units - March 2018
- 1260 single family units **Estimate** (based on rental rate of 7% in Bloomington)

Inspection Program

- Apartments
 - o Common areas, utilities, etc. inspected each year
 - o One third of building units each year, all units inspected over course of 3 years.
- Single family units
 - o Initial inspection, then inspected once every 2 years.

Program Cost

- Initial Cost
 - o 2 vehicles: \$48,000
 - o Reorganization of work stations: \$19,000
 - o Computers and software: \$6,600
 - o Training certification: \$420
 - o Initial Total: \$74,020
- Annual Cost
 - o Staff Salary and Benefits - \$280,680
 - o Vehicle fuel: \$1080
 - o Training/Continuing Education: \$2,500
 - o Central Services = \$22,500
 - o Annual Total: \$306,750
