Mother's Day Metal Casting Saturday, May 11, 10 am – 1 pm

Create a small sculpture, pendant, keychain, brooch or charm through metal casting! Carve an original design - or choose from a selection of symbols and imagery- into a cuttlefish bone to create negative space for your two-piece mold. (Cuttlebone has been used since antiquity to make casts for metal because it withstands high temperatures and is easily carved.) You will fill the negative space with lead-free pewter, do finishing work with hand files/power tools and apply colored inks if desired.
